Enclosed for review and comment by the Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee at its meeting on February 28, 2012, are additional 2013 candidate designs for the United States Mint America the Beautiful Quarters[®] Program coins that will be emblematic depictions of Perry's Victory and International Peace Memorial (Ohio) and Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine (Maryland). These additional designs were prepared based on a previous review by the Citizens Coinage Advisory Committee and the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts.

In accordance with the America's Beautiful National Parks Quarter Dollar Coin Act of 2008 (Act) (Public Law 110-456), the United States Mint shall design, mint and issue quarter-dollar coins that are emblematic of national parks, fish and wildlife refuges, national forests and other national sites selected in accordance with the Act. The 56 host jurisdictions are the 50 States, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, American Samoa, the United States Virgin Islands, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. A portrait of George Washington remains on the obverse of all the quarter-dollar coins.

The additional reverse candidate designs will also be reviewed by the U.S. Commission of Fine Arts at its meeting on February 16, 2012.

We appreciate your review of the enclosed reverse candidate designs at your meeting on February 28th. A representative of the United States Mint will present the candidate designs at this meeting.
